Stewardship: Successful stewardship campaigns were carried out during 2011 and 2015 with pledged increases in giving.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE: The minister is supported by the Kirk Session which meets 5 times per year. The Elders also serve on the Congregational Board which also currently meets 5 times per year. We currently operate according to the Model Constitution and the Kirk Session consists of 23 active elders. There are 23 Elders Districts which have recently been re-organised. In addition to all Elders, the Congregational Board includes at present 5 elected members. In November 2011 Standing Orders were adopted for the regulation of the business of the Session, the Congregational Board and their Committees - Finance and Stewardship, Fabric, Events and Magazine. The parish has a population of some 12,000 people, and the congregation a membership of around 180. Our current activities include Sunday Schools, Bowling Group, Walking Group, Mother and Toddlers group, Soup and Chat, and Bible Study.

Contact with the Congregation: in addition to Elders' visitations, is achieved weekly through the Church intimations and with our Church magazine, which is distributed 4 times a year and also with our website: ayrstquivox.com which is updated regularly. Pastoral Care: A small group of volunteers visit housebound members of the congregation and visit those in Care Homes. Both Churches have small congregations but both have redeeming features. In addition to the normal congregational and parish duties, the minister is associated with the local Primary School as chaplain.







































Dalmilling is a designated Priority Area and the building was the subject of a Feasibility Study which will dictate future planning. This is on-going and will take the next 6-12 months to complete. Currently there is an ongoing local housing redevelop ment / improvement programme in the Dalmilling area.
